What ongoing relationship you envisage between the community & university partners

Continuing exploration of projects of mutual benefit. For example: live project work on planning and regeneration issues in local communities. Training programmes and research at University Centre Hastings.

## 2. Project Information (no more than 1000 words)

Project aims.

- To stimulate more and better community engagement in local planning and regeneration initiatives.
- To improve local library and internet resources on community engagement in local planning and regeneration (Hastings and Rother; past, present and future) in line with the 3-year strategy of the CRRC.
- To create a model for a generic local resource about community engagement in planning which could be adopted by others.

The identified need that the partnership would address.

Evidence from recent consultation exercises shows that there is a widespread desire for:

- More local involvement in shaping the future of the town, both from local people and from agencies (eg HBC planning department);
- Easily accessible knowledge on the best ways of facilitating this involvement;
- Information on what has taken place in the past so that new initiatives can build on past experience rather than having to start from scratch.

This evidence will be tested as part of the project and the needs more closely identified.

What mutual benefit the project would achieve for partners

- Better and more efficient community engagement in planning and regeneration.
- Development of resources at UCH of use to both local people and academics.
- Partnership working by local people and academics.

How you think this funding will support you to pursue a larger project

• It will enable a start to be made on identifying partners, creating an archive of resource material and preparing a development plan to achieve the project aims (see above).

The activities you will undertake to build a development plan for Phase II activities

- Establish a steering group;
- Establish communication networks to keep people informed and obtain feedback;
- Survey of needs of community and voluntary sectors;
- Liaison with CRRC/CUPP researchers in order to establish more precisely the research needs of the community;
- Begin assembling a physical resource at UCH;
- Scoping and feasibility work on an internet resource;
- Production of draft development plan and consultation on it with Steering Group, network of contacts and others.

The impacts you think the project will have and an estimation of the number of people that would benefit.

- Short term stimulate interest in community engagement in planning and provide a focus for sharing information and practice. This will benefit hundreds of people actively involved in planning and regeneration issues, both in the local community and in the university.
- Long term improve quality of planning in Hastings & St Leonards. This will assist improvements to the economy and the environment and will benefit the entire population (c70,000) as well as visitors.

How would this work be embedded academically?

This work feeds into achieving one of the key aims in the CRRC 3-Year Strategy – i.e. to develop at UCH an archive of all materials and documents - past, present and future - that relate to the regeneration of Hastings and area. This will form an invaluable resource as a starting point for all future research and community projects in the area.

Who will own the outputs (e.g. the website content)?

Ownership and copyright issues need to be addressed in the development plan and by the Steering Group. Under UCH's standard Service Level Agreements for archive material, ownership is retained by the provider but this might prove complicated if material comes from many sources. Ownership and copyright of website material is a highly complex area. Expert advice will need to be sought.

#### 3. Project management

Please describe what project management arrangements you will put in place and address the question of ethics.

Nick Wates will manage the project on behalf of Nick Wates Associates. He will be supervised by Peter Ambrose (CRRC) and Mel Bonney-Kane (Hastings Trust) and supported by a steering group drawn from the community and university partners. Sarah Friend will be responsible for creating the library archives with material provided by the community partners. Graphic and web design will be overseen by NWA associate Keith Gillies who has considerable higher education experience and lives and works in St Andrews Square, Hastings. The possibility of media and other students at UCH working on aspects of the project will be fully explored and encouraged. There are not thought to be any ethics issues.

It is proposed to hold three Steering Group meetings during 2010; in July, September and November.
